Learn More About Your Community Pharmacy

Community pharmacies do more than just dispense prescriptions. Your pharmacist is a health care professional who provides many essential services, including:

- Ensuring your prescription medications are safe and optimized for your health
- Answering questions and providing education about your medications and their effects
- Offering recommendations for treatment of minor illness or injury using non-prescription medication
- Supporting you and your health care team in managing chronic conditions like diabetes or high blood pressure

Pharmacy technicians contribute to these efforts by:

- Preparing your prescriptions for the pharmacist to review
- Communicating with and billing your prescription insurance
- Managing pharmacy inventory and other administrative tasks
- Coordinating and assisting with all patient services

Pharmacists and techs are key members of your health care team who offer great care close to home.

Look inside to learn about some additional services pharmacies in Lexington may offer. And ask the team at your pharmacy about all the ways they can help you manage your medications and your health.

Charitable Pharmacy for Uninsured Patients

Faith Pharmacy is a charitable pharmacy that is part of Mission Health Lexington. Low-income, uninsured patients who live in Lexington and are unable to afford their medication may be eligible to receive free prescriptions.

Faith Pharmacy is located at 230 S Martin Luther King Blvd and is only open on Saturday mornings.

Advanced Pharmacy Services

Immunizations: Trained pharmacists or pharmacy technicians can administer vaccines to help protect you from diseases like the flu, COVID-19, shingles, and pneumonia. Some pharmacies require appointments for immunizations while others are open to walk-ins.

Testing for Common Illnesses: Many pharmacies provide point-of-care testing for common illnesses such as the flu, strep throat, and COVID-19. Rapid tests are administered on-site and offer results in minutes. A pharmacist may also be able to start treatment immediately or refer you to a clinic for further care.

Medication Disposal: Safely disposing of unused or expired medication from your home is important to prevent misuse, accidental poisoning, and environmental contamination. Many community pharmacies offer drop boxes, mail-back programs, or home disposal kits to help you get rid of leftover medication.

Naloxone: Naloxone, also called Narcan, is a medication that can quickly reverse the effects of an opioid overdose. It is available without a prescription. Ask a pharmacist to teach you how to recognize and respond to an opioid overdose. You might save a life!

Durable Medical Equipment: Durable medical equipment are devices that support health and mobility needs, including blood pressure monitors, glucose meters, walkers, and nebulizers. Many pharmacies help patients with equipment selection, insurance billing, and usage instruction to ensure safe and effective use.

Unit Dose Packaging: Unit dose packaging can help organize your daily medication for safe and accurate administration. The pharmacy will package medication into blister packs, bubble packs, or strips rather than bottles, making it clear which pills to take each day.

Compounding: Compounding is the preparation of customized prescription medications for a specific need. If you need a special strength, flavor, ingredient, or form that isn't commercially available, ask a pharmacist if a compounded product might be a solution.

Prescription Delivery: Pharmacies may be able to deliver your medications directly to your home. This service offers access and convenience, especially if you have trouble with transportation or mobility.
